Pervious concrete pavement is a unique and effective means to address important environmental issues and support green, sustainable growth. By capturing stormwater and allowing it to seep into the ground, porous concrete is instrumental in recharging groundwater, reducing stormwater runoff, and meeting U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) stormwater regulations. In fact, the use of pervious concrete is among the Best Management Practices (BMPs) recommended by the EPA-- and by other agencies and geotechnical engineers across the country-- for the management of stormwater runoff on a regional and local basis. This pavement technology creates more efficient land use by eliminating the need for retention ponds, swales, and other stormwater management devices. In doing so, pervious concrete has the ability to lower overall project costs on a first-cost basis.



The presentation will be conducted by the Northern Colorado chapter of National Ready Mixed Concrete Association (NRMCA). The information will be very beneficial for current and future projects. The annual Northern Chapter PEC wine tasting party will be held at the above date and place. This event is open to anyone who has an interest in wine and food. So invite your friends who might enjoy this event and help us raise money for our annual Northern Chapter PEC Mathcounts Contest. This will be similar to last year's PEC wine tasting except we will offer more wine with the food.

The theme of this year which was selected by those who attended last year will be wines and foods from Spain and Portugal. Claude Robbins has again graciously agreed to lead the wine tasting program. Claude will provide historical and technical information about the region and its wine. Did you know that Spain has more area plant in vines for wine production than any other country and that the Spanish law requires the use of oak barrows made from American oak tree for some of their highest quality wines?

No other country the size of Portugal has the large variety of wines from both native and imported grapes. This small country offers a large variety of wines from fresh crisp white wines to full body reds. These two countries offer volumes for the wine enthusiast. Mr. Robbins will briefly explain the origins and development of wines in this region. Food common in the region will be served with the various wines to demonstrate wine and food paring.

If you have not attended one of our previous wine tasting parties, I am sure you will be impressed with Mr. Robbins' knowledge of wines, how much you learn, and what an enjoyable time you had. Claude Robbins is one of only 50 Master of Wine Arts (MWA) in the United States and one of only two Master Wine Educators west of the Mississippi. He is currently, president of the International Wine Guild and he and his associates offer a wide variety of wine classes at the Aurora Campus.
